Investors receive a fixed 4.8% annually. The certificate will be redeemed at 100% in June 2029 if the daily closing price of the EURO STOXX 50® Index and the daily LBMA Gold Price PM (3:00 p.m. London) during the term always remain above the respective barrier of 49% of the starting value. If the barrier is violated, the certificate is redeemed according to the performance of the worse-performing underlying. In this case, a significant capital loss is possible.

How the certificate works

At the beginning of the term the starting values of each underlying are fixed and the barriers are calculated on this basis. During the observation period, the underlying prices are compared with the respective barrier.

The fixed interest is unaffected by the performance of the underlying and is paid out in any case. The maximum yield is limited to the amount of these fixed interest payments.

At the end of the term there are two options:

- Barrier was never touched or undercut
The certificate is redeemed at 100%.
- Barrier was touched or undercut at least once
Regardless of which underlying has violated the barrier, the certificate is redeemed according to the performance of the worse-performing underlying (final value compared to the initial value). The maximum redemption remains limited to 100% of the nominal amount.

During the term

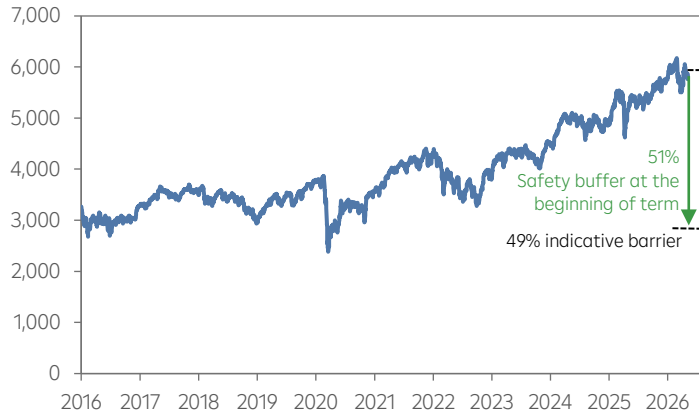

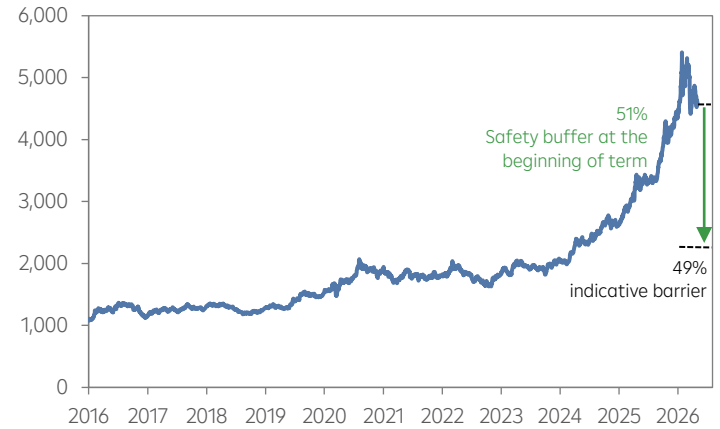
Development in the past
